


# Some Features of Recent World's News as Told by the Photographers





President Taft speaking at Bull Run during the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the first great battle of the Civil War.






"Right there is where we fought the Yankees in '61." This photograph was taken on the battlefield of Bull Run on July 21.

General view of the pier and boats at Quarantine Station, on Staten Island, with a foreign steamer awaiting release.





CHARLES T. WEYMANN, The American aviator, flying in the race, July 1, in England, in which he won the Gordon Bennett cup.






Pushball as an aquatic sport was first tried July 18 at the ladies' day entertainment of the Larchmont Yacht Club. Both teams are made up of club members.



JAMES C. ("BUD") MARS, the well-known aviator, badly hurt in a fall at Erie, Pa., in his flying machine, with his wife.




MARKET DAY IN PORT AU PRINCE, CAPITAL OF HAYTI.
