

MELTON OPPOSED TO HORSE-RACING

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] Norfolk, Va., November 16.—The appeal of the Rev. Sparks W. Melton, D. D., in his address of welcome to the Baptist General Association of Virginia, for the delegates to go home and try to induce their legislators to adopt a bill to end horse racing in Virginia caused a round of applause and a chorus of "Amen's" throughout the auditorium of Freemason street church. About 600 delegates from Baptist Churches in all sections of the State met here to-night for the eighty-eighth annual meeting. The principal business to-night was the introductory sermon by Rev. J. E. Hicks, D. D., of Danville, and the election of officers.

All of the old officers except four vice-presidents were re-elected for another year. They are: Rev. J. M. Pritchard, D. D., of Phoebus, moderator; Rev. Hueb C. Smith, of Christiansburg, secretary; B. A. Jacob, of Richmond, treasurer; J. B. Montgomery, of Richmond, auditor.

The four vice-presidents are: Rev. Walter F. Dunaway, D. D., of Rockingham; Rev. Alfred Bagby, D. D., of Richmond; George O. Greene, of Clifton Forge, and Park T. Deans, of Windsor, Commonwealth's Attorney for the Fifth county. All of the officers were elected by acclamation.

RESIST ARREST, BOTH MEN SHOT

Asheville, N. C., November 16.—In a pitched battle late to-day on the outskirts of Brevard, Transylvania county, Deputy Sheriff Branch Paxton shot and instantly killed Leroy Elrod and badly wounded his father, Thomas Elrod, whom he was trying to arrest.

The Transylvania officers early to-day had been advised to look out for the two Elrods, who are wanted in Pickens county, S. C., for alleged murder. The fugitives were located by Paxton this afternoon. The deputy's demand for surrender was met with a combined rush by the Elrods, Paxton being knocked down. As he fell he drew his pistol and fired two shots, the first bullet killing the younger man, while the second seriously wounded the father. The latter, who admits having killed a man in South Carolina, is a sixty-year-old man, while the son was only nineteen.

NO REPLY TO ULTIMATUM

CLARK OPPOSES ALDRICH PLAN

Kansas City, Mo., November 16.—Speaker Champ Clark to-night disapproved from his set speech before the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress the proposed changes in the nation's currency and banking system, as outlined by former United States Senator Nelson W. Aldrich, chairman of the National Monetary Commission.

United States Senator James A. Reed also spoke in opposition to the proposed plan.

Laying no claim whatever to the character of a financier, Speaker Clark said: "I am utterly opposed to the creation, chartering or authorization of any institution which will deliver into the hands of a few men the powers of life and death, not only over the interests of this country, but over every business in the land."

"Even financiers of renown differ as widely as the poles on the Aldrich plan, and are hesitating. James J. Hill and Leslie M. Shaw, Secretary of the Treasury under the late President, are openly against it on the ground that the Aldrich plan is essentially a monopoly."

"Now, if such eminent financial physicians as Doctors Aldrich, Vreeland and Shreve and Doctors Hill and Shaw disagree as radically on this subject, would we not be acting with more of wisdom and patriotism were to wait long enough at least to hear both sides in this important and far-reaching matter before making up our minds?"
