LYNCHBURG GETS NEXT CONVENTION

State Sunday School Association Closes Annual Session.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.)

Harrisonburg, Va., April 21.—The twenty-first annual State Sunday school convention came to a close to-night, after a busy three-day session, in the Presbyterian Church. Annual election of officers resulted as follows:

President—Dr. M. R. Church, of the Church.

Vice-Presidents—A. L. Phillips, D. D. Roy, J. T. Watts, Jacob Umfahl and Rev. H. D. C. MacLachlan, D. D., all of Richmond; Rev. Thomas C. Darst, of Newport News; Rev. McDaniel Howards, of Norfolk; Rev. G. Hammond, of Harrisonburg; Rev. W. Hoover, of Timberville; Rev. R. C. Drisko, of Herndon; Rev. G. A. Luttrell, of Alexandria.

Treasurer—L. R. Spencer, of Richmond.

General secretary—Thos. C. Dirga, Chairman executive committee—De Witt Crane, of Newport News.

The next place of meeting is Lynchburg.

Today's session opened with a sunrise concert meeting for workers and delegates. Rev. Joseph T. Watts, of Richmond, led, after which adjournment was made for breakfast.

During the morning the visiting Sunday school experts took charge of various schools in town and county. Visiting ministers were distributed among the churches.

A remarkable feature of the convention was the conference tonight at the Diocesan Church. Rev. J. L. Jackson gathered in every boy he could find in town over fifteen years old. Messrs. Chesley, Baker and Hines assisted in the conference. This is the beginning of the Statewide older boys' movement.

The budget for the coming year calls for \$1,000, an increase of 25 per cent. It was approved by the convention and the work of getting the money was started. The collection was the largest in the twenty-one years' history of the association.

At this afternoon's session the subjects discussed were "Teacher Training" by Rev. J. T. Watt, of Richmond; "The Organized Class" by L. E. Wingfield, of Lynchburg; and "The Boy" by Albert M. Chesley, director of boys' work, Y. M. C. A., Washington, D. C.

Delegates will leave for their homes to-morrow morning.

Explosion of Saw Mill Boiler Kills Three Men.

Fredericksburg, Va., April 21.—James Clark, Chas. Schools and White Seal, of Essex county, were killed by a boiler explosion at the saw mill of H. L. Newhall & Son in Essex county.


