

COX CLAIMS STATE FOR CHAMP CLARK

Former Governor of Tennessee Thinks Speaker Will Win. Taft in Lead.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.)
Bristol, Va., May 11.—Former Governor Cox, who is managing Champ Clark's campaign in Tennessee, declares that developments of the past week make it absolutely certain that Clark will have the State in his column. The ex-governor's view is based upon reports from various counties where action was taken during the week. The friends of Woodrow Wilson are, however, not willing to admit that the chances are so good for Clark, and express confidence that they will be able to control the State for Wilson. The friends of Harmoh also have an organization and are active.

As matters now stand, it looks as though Taft has the better of Roosevelt in Tennessee, but the friends of the colored are making boasts that the tide will turn when the delegates assemble in Nashville next Tuesday.

Chancellor Hal H. Haynes is hearing the case of A. S. N. Dobson and others against the board of trustees of Washington and Tusculum College. This cause is in the nature of a divorce proceeding, and seeks to sever the bonds of union between Washington and Tusculum colleges, historic Presbyterian schools in West Tennessee, whose founding dates back to the days of the Revolution. The proceeding involves an endowment of \$100,000, including money given by Carnegie, Mrs. Nattie McCormick and the late Dr. Pearson. The chancellor has already decreed a dissolution of the union, and the matter now to be determined is how the funds shall be divided. Washington College took into the union about \$65,000. The complainants, who represent that branch of the union, are contending for that portion of the endowment and for a division of funds that came in after the union was made. It will probably be a few weeks before the chancellor hands down his decision.

As an artist she inherits her mother's talent, and some of her work has already received notice at the leading exhibits in this country. She is also quite gifted as a writer, having contributed to a number of the prominent magazines.

Count de Logne, count of the estates of Logne and Luxembourg in Belgium, belongs to one of the oldest families of the nobility of Belgium. Three years ago, shortly before his graduation at the University of Louvain, when he was on the point of winning distinction, he gave up his worldly honors and entered the Abbey of Marciens as a Benedictine monk under the name of Brother Hugh, but since even cloistered walls are not proof against Cupid's arrows, he will leave the monastery at the expiration of his novitiate vows next July to resume his former title and position.
