

FIRST SKIRMISHES ARE WON BY TAFT

President Shows Great Strength at Ohio State Convention.

HIS DELEGATES SEATED

Friends Now Confident That They Will Absolutely Control Meeting.

Columbus, Ohio, June 3.—President Taft showed such strength in the preliminary skirmishes to-day that politicians to-night declared he was assured of Ohio's six delegates at-large when the convention resumes to-morrow. In the new State Central Committee, named by county delegates before the opening of the convention, President Taft is conceded eleven of the twenty-one members. His strength in the resolutions committee was shown in the majority report to-night. The committee, by a vote of 12 to 9, decided to recommend to the convention

Mrs. d'Phlanvo and her four small children witnessed the revolver battle. Each of the men fired five shots, and every bullet took effect.

Bitter Fight Sure

Toledo, O., June 3.—Plans of party leaders to have the Ohio Democratic State Convention, which will be called to order here to-morrow evening, adopt resolutions to cast the State's forty-eight votes solidly for Governor Judson Harmon for President at the Baltimore convention unless the unit rule appears certain to precipitate a bitter fight. Although Governor Harmon carried the State at the recent presidential preference primary by nearly 15,000, nineteen district delegates pledged to Wilson were chosen, and they object to being bound under the unit rule to vote for Harmon at Baltimore, and threaten to take the matter before the Democratic National Convention if necessary. The Harmon men declare that their candidate was the choice of the Democratic party of the State at the preferential primary, and that Governor Harmon is entitled to the vote of the solid Ohio delegation at Baltimore. The anti-Harmon forces are said to be endeavoring to effect a compromise by having the State convention endorse Governor Harmon and give him a complimentary vote for President on the first ballot. Governor Harmon's friends, it is said, control the convention and will name the six delegates at large to be chosen, but many Harmon delegates are said to be opposed to tying up the forty-two district delegates under the unit rule. The selection of the six delegates at large and the nominating of a State ticket will take place Wednesday.

DR. MACGLACHLAN AT STATE NORMAL

Richmond Minister Preaches Baccalaureate Sermon Before Young Women. [Special to The Times-Dispatch.] Farmville, Va., June 3.—The commencement of the State Female Normal School began with the senior reception on Saturday evening. An unusual number of guests are in attendance, and about 450 plates were prepared at the banquet following the reception. The reception hall was decorated in the class colors, red and green. On Sunday evening at 8:30 o'clock, in the presence of a large audience as the auditorium would accommodate, the 124 graduates entered singing as a professional hymn, "O Saviour, Precious Saviour, Whom Yet Unseen We Love." It was a most impressive sight, the long line of girls all dressed in simple white suits. As soon as the graduates were seated the services were begun with the hymn, "Day is Dying in the West." This was followed with prayer by Rev. Mr. Allan, pastor of the Farmville Presbyterian Church. The Scripture lesson was read by Rev. Mr. Wray, of the Farmville Baptist Church. Next was Schubert's "The Lord Is My Shepherd," beautifully rendered by the Glee Club of forty.

FASTS TO REDUCE WEIGHT

Atlantic City Man Then Went to Hospital for Treatment. Philadelphia, June 3.—John Watson, of Atlantic City, fasted forty-six days in order to reduce his weight, and then tried to enjoy a meal. Yesterday Watson walked into detective headquarters and asked to be sent to a hospital. He had weighed 116 pounds, which, he thought, was too much. He consulted doctors. They told him to fast, he said. He fasted. Yesterday he weighed 114 pounds, and felt he had accomplished enough. So he ate a real meal. Then he walked into headquarters sick, and asked for assistance. He was sent to the Philadelphia Hospital.

POLITICAL FORTUNE MAY DEPEND ON FIGHT

Roosevelt Has Determined to Oppose Seating of Root as Temporary Chairman of Republican Convention. Oyster Bay, N. Y., June 3.—Upon the selection of the temporary chairman of the Republican convention may hang the political fortunes of ex-President Roosevelt. He decided to-night to oppose with all his strength the seating of Senator Root, and issued a call to all his supporters to stand by him. Colonel Roosevelt declares that "Mr. Root has ranged himself against men who have stood for progressive principles in the Republican party," and says it is William Barnes, Jr., of New York, who is to be the real head of the Taft canvass at Chicago. The Colonel's decision to make a square issue of the seating of Mr. Root was reached after a long consultation with advisers. At Sagamore Hill today were Senator Dixon, Clifford Pinchot, William L. Ward New York; George W. Perkins, New York; Frank B. Kellogg and Andrew Kahn both of whom are from Minnesota, and Truxton Beale, a delegate from California. After Colonel Roosevelt had completed his statement, he brought out the question of whether he is to go to the Chicago convention.
