Eighty Convicts Pardoned by Blease

All Records in South Carolina for Liberation of Prisoners in One Day Broken.
Columbia, S. C., December 24.—All records in this state for the number of pardons granted in one day were broken to-day, when, by order of Governor Blease, eighty convicts confined in the State Penitentiary and serving on charginangs throughout the state were liberated, their pardons being granted as Christmas presents.

DOZEN CONCERNS VICTIMS OF FRAUD

Through Bogus Collection Scheme Lose \$300,000 in Last Few Months.

Pittsburgh, Pa., December 24.—A dozen large business concerns, including the Carnegie Trust Company and several great packing firms, have been defrauded through a collection scheme of upwards of \$300,000 in the last few months, according to R. B. Mundell, a post-office inspector of Chicago, who arrested W. W. Fellers and Joseph Finkleman here to-day on the charge of using the mails to defraud.

FIFTEEN INJURED IN WRECK

Seminole Limited, Filled With Tourists, Is Derailed.
Americus, Ga., December 24.—Fifteen persons were injured, several seriously, when passenger train No. 8, known as the Seminole Limited on the Central of Georgia Railroad, was wrecked five miles north of here to-day. The train was filled with tourists bound from Florida to points in the Central West and that none was killed is a miracle. A bad alignment of the rails is given as the cause of the accident. Three sleepers left the rails, but did not turn over. Relief trains were rushed from Americus and Columbus and the tracks were cleared by midday.

Bristol, Va., December 24.—Forest M. Runnels, for three years secretary of the Bristol Board of Trade, was to-day appointed assistant industrial agent of the Carolina, Clinchfield and Ohio Railways, with a handsome salary attached. Mr. Runnels is forty years old, and for twenty years has devoted most of his time to a study of industrial promotion. His earliest work was as a newspaper writer. He had experience with Memphis, St. Louis, Chicago and Pacific coast newspapers. Afterwards he devoted some time to the industrial development of Mississippi, having located industries with nearly half a million capital at Columbus, Miss. He has been devoted to the commercial and industrial interests of the city and to the promotion of highways. He has accomplished much, and leaves work already begun which, if carried out by his successor, will prove of great value to the future of Bristol.
