TEACHERS MEET AT BUCKINGHAM
Addresses by Evan R. Chesterman, Dr. C. Alphonso Smith and Others.

Arvonla, Va., April 13.—One of the most interesting and instructive educational meetings of recent years was held at Buckingham courthouse on Friday, the meeting being well attended, in spite of the rain, and much enthusiasm developed.

Dr. Charles Alphonso Smith, of the University of Virginia, delivered an address upon the "Ministry of Health." This speech was generally regarded as the greatest of the kind ever heard in this county.

Superintendent Plummer F. Jones delivered a short address upon "Industrial Training in the Schools." He stated that an experiment of one year with colored pupils had convinced him that no more valuable work can be done in the rural schools than that done by well paid traveling inspectors.


