BIG DELEGATION FOR COLORED PARK

Representative Negroes Petition Mayor in Favor of Its Establishment. Headed by John Mitchell, Jr., president of the Mechanics' Saving Bank, and Giles B. Jackson, a well-known colored lawyer of this city, a committee of nineteen, representing the most progressive element of the negro race in Richmond, called upon Mayor Ainslie yesterday with a petition favoring the plan of establishing one or more public parks for the exclusive use of colored people.

The views expressed were notably at variance with those presented to the Mayor by the colored delegation about a week ago. These protesters against the establishment of a colored park on the ground that it would become a meeting place for the more and more belligerent members of the race, and would be stigmatized by the better element of negroes.

DR. A. G. CROCKETT IS BADLY INJURED State Senator Bruised and Wounded When Horse Runs Away. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.) Wytheville, Va., July 30.—Dr. A. G. Crockett, State Senator from this district, met with a serious runaway accident yesterday afternoon at Fort Chiswell, the home of James H. McGavock, in which he received severe wounds in the forehead, with two ribs broken and one of his lungs bruised. Dr. Crockett had been called to Fort Chiswell to attend Mr. Priscott, the father of Mrs. McGavock, who in a fall from the porch had fractured his leg. After ministering to his patient, the doctor got in his buggy to drive home. In hitching one of the "hold back" straps was not fastened, and the buggy running down on the horse, he dashed off, throwing the doctor out, his coming in contact with a crib, inflicting the injuries as above. Doctor W. W. Chaffin, who is attending the injured man, is said to consider his injuries quite serious, but not necessarily dangerous. The accident in many respects is similar to that of Mr. Craighill received on Sunday afternoon on his trip to Ivanhoe, the second time the forehead being a little lower than that of Mr. Craighill.

WILL RESTORE TAXES Corporation Commission Orders That Real Estate Tax Be Assessed as in 1911. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.) Raleigh, N. C., July 30.—The Corporation Commission to-day issued a permanent order that the assessments of Washington County for the real estate tax assessment valuations that were assessed in 1911, and which were arbitrarily reduced in 1912, or more by the commissioners in 1912, be restored to the assessments in Washington County. The Corporation Commission insists that the Washington commissioners had no right to make the reduction, except through appeal to the State Tax Commission, constituted by the Corporation Commission. The Corporation Commission directed the Washington commissioners to restore the State taxes from Washington in the amount of \$1,000,000 and the State is demanding that this amount be restored in the settlement for the 1912 taxes. The Washington commissioners are directed to appear before the Corporation Commission August 11 and show cause why there should not be a complete restoration of the 1911 valuations.

Involuntary Bankrupt. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.) Lynchburg, Va., July 30.—Baltimore creditors of L. Shuster, a merchant of Charlottesville, have filed an involuntary petition in bankruptcy in the United States District Court here, three petitioners filing claims in the proceedings to an aggregate of about \$1,400.
