

Nelso's legs, and was picked up by Bicycle Policeman Thurman. Upon examination, it was seen that only two bullets had been used.

Chief of Police Werner and Captain George W. Epps, of the Second District, to which Nelso was assigned, hurried to the scene of the murder in an automobile patrol, but there was nothing for them to do.

The fact was clearly established that Nelso had been a frequent visitor at the home of Mrs. Lester, and is said to have known her for several years.

His wife was prosecuted when told of her husband's use by Patrolman Epps, an intimate friend of Nelso, who he would do it, she reportedly shrieked.

Mrs. Lester was the daughter of Benjamin William Jones, of 219 South Main street, a contractor on the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway. He left the city a short while before the murder, but was notified by telegraph when the murder occurred.

She returned to the city on an engine. Besides her two children and father, Mrs. Lester has her mother and the following brothers and sisters: Miss Amanda W. Jones, Mrs. Thomas L. Jones and Mrs. W. Jones, Jr.

Mrs. Lester's two children, James, aged three years, and Grace, six, were taken to their grandparents' on West Main street.

Chloroform in Pocket. Nelso went to Mrs. Lester's home apparently determined to kill her. He took a small bottle containing chloroform with him. He also had a small piece of muslin cotton in his pocket, which he had intended to use to stuff the wound.

It was reported that the chloroform and a small piece of muslin cotton were found in the pocket of the coat which he wore at the time of the murder.

Nelso was known to be a man of quick and furious temper, which upon occasions had caused him some trouble. Only a few months ago he was fined in police court for making an attack upon a neighbor. Besides his wife he leaves four children.

Case at Home. Detective Sergeant Whaley, who conducted the investigation for the police, said that the only apparent cause of the shooting was the association of Nelso with the woman, and that she was the cause of his death.

Major Werner said that more than a year ago complaint was made to him by a woman in the name of Mrs. Lester, who was a neighbor of his. She had a revolver and was regarded as a crack shot.

He had a reputation as a crack shot with the revolver, and by many was regarded as the best marksman in the department.

No Chance to Save Life. Nelso died at 11:10 o'clock, just after reaching the hospital. He was taken to the room set apart by the Administration Board and furnished by the Police Commissioners for the department.
