

VOLCANIC SHOW ERUPT AGAIN

Dr. Thomas A. Jaggar Tells of Recent Observations of Sakura-Jima.

Tokio, April 11.—The Sakura-Jima volcano, whose eruption in January caused great devastation, is likely to show still further activity, according to Dr. Thomas A. Jaggar, professor of geology at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and director of the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory. Dr. Jaggar, who has just ascended Sakura-Jima, made the following statement to the Associated Press concerning his observations:

"Owing to the closure of the eastern passage around the island, the average tide level in Kagoshima Bay has risen two feet. In the short space of 1,000 years remarkable changes may take place in the topography of the Gulf of Kagoshima. To preserve the symmetry of the volcanic cone, Sakura-Jima is likely to erupt once or twice on the northern side in the future, and if the lava ejected will be equal to the amount thrown out this year, it might easily cut off the northern part of the gulf, thus forming a bay. Then the water level would rise, and finally the bay would become fresh, so that a large lagoon may possibly be formed. The present villages on the northern shore may in time be submerged, just as the temples of Philae were covered by the Nile after the completion of the Aswan Dam, in Egypt.

"We climbed two-thirds of the way to the summit in an ash shower. Lava was still flowing, though less copiously, and the average level of the lava flow 200 feet. A phenomenon difficult to explain was the presence of round pits four feet deep and ten feet in diameter on the western side in devastated areas. I am not willing to accept the Japanese hypothesis that they were formed by lightning bolts. They were probably due to the impact of falling stones, or to the explosion of substances buried by their fall in the moist earth."

The new island which recently sprung up near the Bonin group, off Japan, had been visited by a party from the steamer Chefoo, who described it as a mass of lava, covered with pumice stone and white ash. The Chefoo locates the island at latitude 34° 45' N. and longitude 141° 22' E. When the steamer approached the island appeared as a white, with blackish cliffs rising about 200 feet. For a radius of three miles the sea was filled with floating stones. The land party found it exceedingly dangerous to row near the cliffs, as they were breaking away and falling into the sea to join the already great mass of pumice. Also, on account of the very soft nature of the surface, no attempt was made to journey inland.

The main crater was located to the southwest, being a quarter of a mile wide. It emitted enormous clouds of black smoke, and occasional jets of light blue or white steam. On the eastern side a small crater, which discharged poisonous fumes, made an approach impossible. The water about was warm.
