



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ANNOUNCE CHANGES IN TONIGHT'S BIG PARADE

Flow Alterations Are Made From Original Plans for Line of March. POSITIONS ARE ASSIGNED

The line of march for the parade of the "Vello" Prophets today has been changed from originally arranged. The grooves, which will be headed by Samis Grotto, No. 36, have drawn their positions, which will be found below:

Chief Marshal William M. Myer announced the appointment of Prophet David A. Brown, Jr., as chief of staff. The staff will report to the chief marshal at the Tenth Street entrance of the City Hall at 6:45 o'clock.

The several organizations participating will report promptly at the City Hall entrance at 6:30 o'clock, and will immediately upon their arrival report to the chief marshal at the Tenth Street entrance.

IN TWO RANKS The military will form in line, and the grooves will form in two ranks at the following designated places: Platoon of police, north side of Broad Street, south, right resting on Ninth Street.

The plan written by the American Delegates, after consultation with Washington, is brief, and includes several counterpropositions of which the Huerta delegates will be advised tomorrow.

From the mediators themselves it became known that the differences in the two plans are slight. A full conference of all delegates and mediators will be held tomorrow or Wednesday. This is for the formal consideration and final drafting of the protocol.

QUESTION OF ANTILLA NOT YET DISPOSED OF Although the question of whether the Antilla would be permitted to land her ammunition at Tampico was not finally disposed of to-day, the Mexican delegates let it be known that, while they would not object to the Antilla being returned to New York, they were not disposed to interrupt mediation, even if the ammunition finally got ashore.

It is understood that a diplomatic approach to internal questions would meet the approval of the mediators, but the mediators insist on an armistice. The Constitutionals want to know how the mediators intend to handle the situation.

While the details are necessarily withheld until there is a final agreement, it is known that a large share in the new provisional government will be given to the Constitutionals. If they accept its principles, little work would remain for the mediation commission.
