

LOCAL INTELLIGENCE.

ACCIDENT ON THE STEAMER JAS. T. BRADY. There was considerable anxiety expressed yesterday morning, in consequence of the steamer Jas. T. Brady of the new line of Baltimore steamers, failing to arrive at the usual hour.

ROW IN PORTSMOUTH BETWEEN THE SOLDIERS AND NEGROES. Yesterday afternoon Portsmouth was the scene of a riotous and distinctly answered the soldiers and negroes.
