FRIDAY, JANUARY 19, 1866. PUGILISM. A PRIZE FIGHT BETWEEN JAMES KERRIGAN AND MORRIS PHELAN FOR \$500.

PUGILISM

From the New York Herald of Wednesday. A prize fight for \$500 came off on Tuesday afternoon in Pike county, Pennsylvania, opposite Port Jervis, Orange county, N. Y., between James Kerrigan and Morris Phelan, which was won by Kerrigan in twenty-eight minutes.

Morris Phelan is twenty-six years old, stands five feet six and a half inches, and his fighting weight is one hundred and thirty pounds. He was born in Ireland, brought up in Manchester, England, and began his fighting career in Liverpool.

James Kerrigan was born in the city of New York, in the Fourth ward, is 23 years of age, weighs one hundred and thirty-six pounds, and stands five feet eight inches high. He is a very muscular, well built young man, and although never before in the prize ring, has for a long time been looking for an opportunity to exhibit his abilities as a pugilist.

Round 1. As the men were delivered at the scratch by their seconds John Roche and Kid Burns looking after the interests of Kerrigan, while Phelan had for his seconds George Lees and Dooney Harris—a marked contrast was observed in their appearance. Phelan looking like a pale and emaciated man, while Kerrigan appeared in robust health and, as hard as brass.

Round 2. The men responded quickly to the call of time, and after measuring each other for a moment, Kerrigan stepped back and the blow fell short. Phelan, however, was more successful in another attempt, his left hand having caught Jim on the mouth, which drew blood—two previous left-handers of Phelan's having passed over the head of Kerrigan. The latter now dashed in and left and right, the latter taking effect on the left side of Morris' head. A clinch, wrestle and fall ensued, when Phelan was again under on the hard earth.

Round 3. Kerrigan came up the scratch and left the mouth, and the first event was claimed by the Phelan party. Morris already in the fight seemed fatigued, and his bellows appeared choked. Kerrigan led off with his left and was prettily stopped by Phelan, who, in return, sent out his left on a voyage of discovery, which landed on the back of Kerrigan's head, the latter having ducked to avoid the blow. Kerrigan then dashed in his left and right, the latter taking effect on the left side of Phelan's head, which staggered him.

Round 4. Phelan went up quickly to his adversary and commenced hostilities by sending out his left at the latter's face, which, however, was out of distance, and a second shot from the same quarter went over his head. It was now Kerrigan's turn to retaliate, and he dashed in quickly with his left and right, both of which were parried, but getting into close quarters, he soon threw Phelan and fell on him.

Round 5. The hard falls that Phelan had been receiving were not impairing his prospects much, but still he came up quickly at the call of time, and soon led off with his left at Kerrigan's head. This was stopped on its mission, and a return of left and right from Kerrigan, although not heavily, when the parties clinched, and Phelan got down without being thrown, but in a legitimate way.
