PROCEEDINGS OF CONGRESS.

WASHINGTON, March 13. SENATE.—Mr. Sherman introduced a joint resolution, which has been passed, to regulate outstanding United States notes not bearing interest and including the fractional currency, shall not be diminished below four hundred and twenty millions of dollars.

The bill for the admission of Colorado was then taken up. After debate, the Senate refused to take a vote on the bill—years 14; says, 22. Colorado excludes negro suffrage.

HOUSE.—The House, by a vote of 109 against 39, passed the Senate bill, with amendments, that all persons born in the United States and not subject to any foreign power, and who are citizens of the United States; and such citizens, without regard to any previous condition of slavery or involuntary servitude—except as a punishment for crime, whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall have the same right to make and enforce contracts, to sue, be parties, give evidence; to inherit, purchase, lease, sell and convey real and personal property, and to sue full and equal benefit of all laws and proceedings for the security of person and property as is enjoyed by white citizens; and shall be subject to like punishment, pains and penalties, and to none other—any law, statute, ordinance, regulation or custom to the contrary, notwithstanding.

General Orders, No. 9.—The former owners of land upon the Sea Islands on the coast of South Carolina, with the exception of Port Royal, St. Helena, Ladies, and Hilton Head Islands, and such other islands as may have been sold by the United States Land Commissioners for taxes, and the owners of land on the Main, embraced in Gen. Sherman's Field Orders, No. 15, will be permitted to return and occupy their lands, or a portion of them, subject to the terms and conditions herein specified.
