**ASSASSINS PROMOTED.**  
Belgrade, June 22.—The promotions are announced of various members of the military deputation to King Peter at Geneva.  
Colonel Popovics, of the late King Alexander's palace guard, is created a general and first aide-de-camp to King Peter.  
Captain Kostics, who opened the palace gates for the assassins of the late king and queen, is promoted to be a major.  
Lieutenant Gronica, who was on guard outside the palace on the night of the assassination and who was a confidant of the conspirators, is made a captain.  
In view of the fact that Austria and Russia have demanded the punishment of the assassins and England has practically severed diplomatic relations with the new dynasty, the promotions of the conspirators are considered extremely significant. It is taken to mean that the military clique will brook no interference with its regime and is prepared to risk the disfavor of the powers to attain its ends.  
The deputation to escort King Peter to Belgrade is now at Geneva and the royal party is expected to arrive at Vienna tomorrow evening enroute to the Servian capital.

**THEY PUT HIM OUT.**  
Baseball Fans Assaulted the Constable at Findlay, Ohio.  
Findlay, O., June 22.—Constable Enoch Johnson was assaulted by George Bell, an oil well driller, Sunday while attempting to stop a ball game between the Eberhards of Cleveland and a local team. Bell is alleged to have struck Johnson a terrific blow in the face, which nearly knocked the constable down, and then Bell, with the assistance of others, dragged Johnson from the grounds, a distance of 200 feet.  
When Bell had gotten rid of Johnson he surrendered himself to a deputy marshal. There is much excitement in Findlay over the question of Sunday ball games, and those who favor them are said to be as many as those who do not. The ball players were arrested, but released when their fines were paid.

**STRIKERS LOST BATTLE.**  
Great Lowell Mills' Conflict Ends in Defeat.  
Lowell, Mass., June 22.—The textile council Sunday afternoon declared the great strike in the Lowell mills at an end. Every union affiliated with the council was represented, and the vote was unanimous.  
Mule spinners and loom fixers were included in this vote, despite statements that they would oppose a return to work.  
The meeting lasted about an hour. There was no dissension. The situation was discussed carefully and with no suggestion of excitement. The vote showed every delegation favorable to return to work at once.  
When asked for a statement President Conroy smilingly said: "We now worship at the altar of defeat, but later we shall rise again and conquer."

**Indians Exclude Whites.**  
Hobart, Okla., June 22.—The Indian Baptist association, which is composed entirely of Kiowa Indians, has adopted a resolution excluding all whites from their meetings. Missionaries working among the Indians announce this as a result of the timidity of the Indians in participating in religious exercises in the presence of the whites. Lone Wolf, who recently brought suit against the United States government to prevent the opening of the Kiowa reservation to settlement, is their chief minister and presides during the convention now in session. He is a Carlisle graduate.  
Killed by Her Lover.  
Laurel, Del., June 22.—Miss Katie Atkins was shot and instantly killed at her home in Salisbury, Md., Saturday night by Elmer Hath, her lover. After killing the young woman Hath fired three bullets into his own and fell unconscious. He was hurried in an ambulance to jail to prevent a lynching. He may recover. The dead girl and her lover are under 21 and were to have been married last Thursday, but Miss Atkins broke the engagement when she learned Hath had stolen money from his employer.  
Riots in French Towns.  
Paris, June 22.—Several riots arising out of collisions between clerical and anti-clerical, are reported from several towns in the provinces in connection with religious processions. At Brest an anti-clerical mob attempted to seize the host from the hands of the priest as the procession was about to re-enter the cathedral. A free fight ensued in which fifteen persons, mostly women, were injured. Less serious troubles occurred at Nantes and Angers.  
Emigration Has Doubled.  
Copenhagen, June 22.—The emigration figures for May, 1903, show that more than twice as many persons emigrated from Denmark to America as during the same period last year, and the "American fever" shows no signs of abating. It is shown, however, that the money sent back by Scandinavian settlers in the United States offsets to a large degree the loss to the country caused by the emigration of so many of its best citizens.

**Mrs. McKnight Held For Trial.**  
Kalkaska, Mich., June 29.—The examination of Mrs. McKnight was concluded Saturday and resulted in the committing of the accused for trial without bail. Only one witness was put on the stand that day, Sheriff Creighton being called by the prosecution to testify as to the identity of the remains exhumed as those of John Murphy. The accused woman, who has maintained her composure throughout this terrible ordeal, was considerably affected by the decision and trembled with the emotion she could no longer conceal as she was conducted by the officers to the carriage awaiting to convey her back to jail.  
Postoffice Robbed.  
Grand Haven, Mich., June 29.—The safe in the postoffice at Spring Lake was blown open by robbers early Sunday morning and \$300 in stamps and money stolen. The thieves left town in a rig stolen from the barn of Mrs. A. Mulder. Besides money and stamps Postmaster Fall reports loss of valuable private papers.  
LATE NEWS IN BRIEF.  
Fatally Assaulted.—L. M. Wilson, who says he is a traveling salesman for the Armour Packing company, was assaulted in St. Joseph, Mo., Sunday and fatally cut. He claims to be ignorant of the identity of his assailant.  
A War Probable.—A dispatch from Vienna to the London Morning Leader says the situation in the Vilayet of Adrianople is very grave. It is reliably stated that the Turkish authorities are organizing a regular persecution of the Bulgarian inhabitants, their villages being razed to the ground.  
Stranger Kills Himself.—Mystery surrounds the identity of a stranger whose lifeless body was found in Chicago in the Hotel Bismarck. The man, who had registered as John D. Munger, Denver, had shot himself in the right temple. In his pockets the police found \$25.  
Teachers to Boston.—Before the present week is ended special trains from all parts of the country will be speeding toward Boston with thousands of general teachers to attend the forty-second annual convention of the National Educational Association, which opens its sessions Monday, July 6.  
Boat Overtaken—Two Drowned.—Two persons, Miss Lee and Miss Thelma Williams, were drowned while boating on the St. Louis river at St. Louis, Mo., Sunday afternoon. While rowing with two companions, who were saved, their boat was overturned by the wash of an excursion steamer.

**LEFT MEXICO CITY.**  
Moreland Says He Will Return to Detroit.  
City of Mexico, June 30.—D. W. H. Moreland, the runaway commissioner of public works of Detroit, left here last night for Chihuahua, where he said he would meet his attorney and then return to Detroit to contest his impeachment, by God!  
He appeared to be troubled over failure to hear satisfactory news from Detroit, and wore a very worried look whenever asked as to his future plans.  
Moreland still insisted, however, that he was not a fugitive from justice.  
"I am a fugitive from ill-health and nothing else," is the stereotyped phrase with which he met every question bearing upon why he is here at a time when it would be so interesting for him to be in Detroit. He positively declined to talk about his removal from office, and his declination is quite noisy, and certainly most profane.  
Daughter Claims a Share.  
Corunna, Mich., June 30.—The valuable estate of Mrs. Ruby Shattuck who died about ten years ago at her home in Owosso, will be investigated at the application of a daughter in Cleveland, who claims to have been frozen out when the estate was divided. Assistant Prosecuting Attorney W. J. Parker of Corunna will act as administrator. His bond will be in the sum of \$50,000.

**Died in a Bathtub.**  
Detroit, Mich., June 30.—Mrs. Jessie Hodges, wife of Schuyler G. Hodges, former president of the Hodges house at Pontiac, and well-known in Detroit, was found dead in a bathtub at Mrs. Fox's rooming house, 155 Wayne street, about 7:30 o'clock last evening. Dr. J. A. Winter was hastily called, but life was extinct. He gave his opinion that heart failure caused her death.  
His Eyesight Returning.  
Bay City, Mich., June 30.—James Ouelette, a former mail carrier, who has been unable to walk, and totally blind since 1892, when he fell on an icy walk while delivering mail, says he now begins to get use of his eyes. He can distinguish between day and night.  
Consolidation Reported.  
Battle Creek, Mich., June 30.—There is a well-founded rumor current here, which it is impossible to verify by the parties interested, that the plants of the Gage Printing company and the Pilgrim magazine have been, or will be, consolidated, the firm to continue the publication of the periodical.

**Colored Man, White Woman.**  
Port Huron, Mich., June 30.—Robert Lawson, colored, and Rachael Porter, a 19-year-old white girl, were arrested upon a serious charge. On the way to jail Lawson was almost terrified over a report that he would be lynched. The couple claim they were to be married next week.

Another Grand Jury.—A grand jury to investigate legislative hoodlums will convene in Jefferson City, Mo., in July.  
"Elsie Venner" Dramatized.—A dramatization of Oliver Wendell Holmes' "Elsie Venner" was given in initial presentation Monday night in Kansas City. The production was well received.  
Jumped to Her Death.—Mrs. Nora Winfrey of Leeds, Mo., aged 19 years, committed suicide by jumping from the bridge over the Blue river in that city. Her husband, George Winfrey, aged 21 years, drowned while trying to rescue her.  
Thieves Ransacked His House.—During the absence at Lake Forest of the family of Dr. Walter Wever, German consul in Chicago, thieves entered the Wever residence, ransacked the house, ripped open the upholstery of the furniture in their search for valuables, and took away with them a number of pictures and valuable curios. Luckily Mrs. Wever had taken her jewels to Lake Forest with her.  
Barely Escaped Alive.  
Mobile, Ala., June 30.—The crews of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Co. at West Pascagoula, Miss., were Monday destroyed by fire, which was caused by some mechanics who were working on an elevated oil tank dropping a red hot iron bolt in the tank. An explosion occurred and the workmen barely escaped with their lives. The whole structure was burned, together with 12,000 barrels of oil.
