A Word on the Fuel Situation

We have at this time about 700 tons of coke on hand that is being delivered about the city as fast as our teams can make delivery. We have many orders ahead and it will be impossible for us to deliver coke on the same day that it is ordered. Kindly, therefore, order your coke several days before you are completely out of fuel.

Because of the increasing cost of coal and labor, the cost of producing coke is constantly increasing. The coal that we produce coke from has risen 65 per cent in cost, and the cost of labor has increased 45 per cent. It is the intention of this company to keep the price of coke as low as possible and there is no intention to take advantage of the fuel shortage situation in any way. In order to combat its rising cost prices, however, the Gas Company will be forced, from time to time, to announce an increase in its coke prices. While we sincerely hope that government regulations will enable us to purchase coal more cheaply, and therefore sell coke more cheaply, still it is our belief that prices on coal and coke will continue to rise during the winter. If so, we trust that this word of explanation will explain our position.
