Michigan's War Activities

We have contracted for the purchase of a thousand farm tractors and an equal number of tractor plows, and if more are needed they will be forthcoming. These tractors will be resold to individual farmers, under a guarantee from each purchaser that he will keep his machine constantly at work.

Last summer the "I. W. W.'s" started in to make trouble in the Iron Country, but the despatch of a detachment of our mounted State Constabulary to the scene stopped the trouble in the bud, and we are assured by those in closest touch with the situation that our prompt action in this matter avoided serious disturbance in the mining region of the State.

In each of our eighty-three counties we have established a County War Board. The County Boards in turn have recommended a Township or Ward Board in each township and ward in the State.

In this connection mention should be made of the splendid work which has been done by the women of Michigan. They have risen nobly to the occasion and their efforts have been most effective.

Flour rations for families doing their own baking; and those purchasing Victory bread from bakers, based on a maximum allowance of one and one-half pounds of flour per person per week:

Table with columns: Flour Rations Per Person Per Week, Number in Family (2, 3, 4, 5, 6), and Flour amounts for various uses (Bread, other purposes, flour).

In explanation of the seeming disparity between flour rations permitted families doing their own baking and those purchasing Victory bread, it is pointed out that households depending on bakeries and buying Victory bread under the one and one-half pound flour ration are permitted to use one and three-quarters pounds of Victory bread per person per week.

(Continued from page one) Leaving here at 8:30 we began to see leaves, blue grass country, hills, negroes and flowers. Here, too, was where we saw some very fine scenery. Our next stop was at Richmond, Ky., and I think that if ever I wish hospitality and friends, I shall go back to old Richmond. It was at this station that we were met by our largest, most hospitable and most patriotic crowd of the trip.

Now we began to pass through tunnels, some very large and long. We passed through about thirty during daylight and as many more at night. Windows had to be closed in passing through on account of smoke and cinders. Hills? Well we haven't any hills in Michigan. Rocks composed of sandstone, quartz and marble stone, rising almost vertically into the air.

We now retired in our various quarters and positions, some sitting up, some standing up and some lying down with feet sticking out in the aisle. We passed through Atlanta about midnight, making a short stop, but most of us were so sleepy and tired, and it was dark and raining hard that we did not see anything of the city. Then on to Camp Gordon, where we were ordered to get our luggage and leave the train.
