NOTICE SERVED

Purcell Serves Notice on Sheriff Willert to Show Ownership.

The city officials intended this week to go to St. Louis and secure the well digging machinery which was recently replevined under the action which was started against A. R. Purcell, contractor, but a notice has been served on Sheriff Willert by Purcell for a hearing within five days to determine the title of the machinery.

The view taken by the city officials is that as the contract has never been completed, the title of the machinery is with the City of Alma, as under the contract it was provided that the title of the machinery should be with the city pending satisfactory completion of the contract.

Purcell set forth in his notice that the machinery was needed in order that St. Louis might obtain its pure water supply this fall, and under the statutes Purcell has the right to demand such a hearing to determine possession, and if it is found to rest with Purcell he will be immediately able to resume his work in St. Louis.

The hearing is expected to be held before Judge Moinet in circuit court on Saturday, although it may be delayed until sometime next week. Purcell evidently hopes that the court will set a smaller bond than that which is provided by the statute.
