

Tuesday evening the city commission rescinded its action of December 9 and 16, when resolutions regarding the turning over of portions of the trunk line highways in Alma to the county road commissioners, were passed, and then resolutions, prepared by the state department, with the same end in view, were passed to comply with a request. The state has prepared a form of resolutions which will be used entirely for this work.
