D. 1920, at 6 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, at the Chambers of the said City Commission, in the City Hall of the City of Alma; and be it further

Resolved that the required notice for the vacating, abolishing and setting aside of the said south one rod of said Hawley Lane, except said alley, be given, as required by Section 5 of Chapter XXVIII of the City Charter.

Commissioner Creaser supported the above resolution which was carried by a yeas and nays vote as follows

Yeas: Commissioners Chick, Creaser and Archer. Nays: None. Mr. Reynolds stated to the Commission the necessity of making a charge to residents of the city who were connecting with City sewers but whose property was not included in any special assessment district.

Moved by Commissioner Creaser and supported by Commissioner Chick that above matter be referred to City Manager and City Attorney. Motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Chick and supported by Commissioner Archer that the City Commission adjourn. Motion carried.
