D. 1920, at 6 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, at the Chambers of the said City Commission, in the City Hall of the City of Alma; and be it further Resolved that the required notice for the vacating, abolishing and setting aside of the said south one rod of said Hawley Lane, except said alley, be given, as required by Section 5 of Chapter XXVIII of the City Charter.
