

NOTICE OF MEETING

To Whom it May Concern: Whereas, on the 3rd day of August, A. D. 1920, an application was filed with E. R. Laycock, County Drain Commissioner of the County of Gratiot, for the locating, establishing, extending and tiling a certain drain, which said drain was described in said application as follows, to-wit:

Commencing in the channel of Pine River on Block 36, Original Plat, City of Alma about sixteen rods east of South State Street, thence in a Northwesterly course across the Mill-race and the Ann Arbor railroad, about twenty-five rods to a point where the open drain known locally as Kress Creek, parallels the Ann Arbor railroad, thence following the line of said Kress Creek as nearly as practicable across the Pere Marquette railroad and South State street, crossing blocks 6 and 4 of Elyton Addition to the City of Alma, and crossing West Superior Street at a point about thirty rods east of the North West Corner of Section 3, City of Alma.

Thence following the course of the aforesaid creek in a northwesterly direction across Jas. G. Kress Addition to the City of Alma, crossing Wright avenue at a point about twenty-nine rods north of West Superior street, thence continuing northwesterly and crossing the South 1-8 line of Section 33, City of Alma, at a point about thirty-five rods west of Wright avenue.

Thence north across Udelle Addition to the City of Alma, following the line of Garfield street, crossing the Quarter line to Section 33, City of Alma, at about thirty-five rods west of Wright avenue.

Thence following the general course of the creek across the SE 1/4 of NE 1/4, Section 33, City of Alma, to a point about sixteen rods south of the center of the northeast quarter of the aforesaid Section 33.

Thence following the low land generally in a northwest direction more or less parallel to the Ann Arbor Railroad for one hundred sixty rods, thence South and West crossing the Ann Arbor Railroad at the point where said railroad crosses the quarter line of Section 28, Pine River Twp., and continuing across the SE 1/4 of the SW 1/4, crossing the South line of Section 28 about forty rods west of the Quarter line. Thence continuing west and southwest and end on the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4, Section 33, Pine River Twp., about forty rods East and twenty rods south of the Northwest corner of Section.

Branch No. 1— Branch commencing in the channel of the Main drain at a point about thirty rods South and Twenty-one rods West on intersection of Wright Ave. with the South 1-8 line section 33 of City of Alma.

Thence west across the right of way of the Ann Arbor and Pere Marquette railroads and continuing West twenty rods more or less and end.

Branch No. 2— Branch commencing in the channel of the Main Drain at a point about sixteen rods North and thirty-five rods West of the East Quarter post, section 33, City of Alma, thence in a Northeasterly direction about forty five rods crossing Wright avenue about thirty-three rods north of the aforesaid quarter post and end.

Branch No. 3— Branch commencing in the channel of the Main Drain at a point about twelve rods North of the center of the NE 1/4 of Section 33, City of Alma, thence West and Southwest following the low lands and crossing the Ann Arbor Railroad about twelve rods north of north 1-8 line of Section 33, City of Alma, thence continuing south and west, crossing the quarter line at a point about seventy rods north of the center of the aforesaid section 33, thence continuing west eighty rods more or less and end.

That said Drain will traverse the City of Alma and the township of Pine River in said County. Therefore notice is hereby given that in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided, a joint meeting of the Township Board of the Township of Pine River and the City Commission of the City of Alma will be held on the 1st day of September, A. D. 1920, at the Chambers of the City Commission, in the City of Alma, in said County of Gratiot, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon of said day for the purpose of determining the necessity of said drain and whether the said proposed drain is necessary and conducive to the public health, convenience and welfare. At said meeting any and all persons owning lands liable to assessment for benefits or whose lands shall be crossed by said Drain may appear for or against said proceedings, and may be heard in relation thereto.
