SALVATION ARMY DRIVE MAY 7-12

COUNTY COMMITTEE FOR CAMPAIGN IS NOW BEING SECURED IN GRATIOT.

Brigadier Samuel Withers, Commander of the Michigan Division of the Salvation Army, announced today that the annual appeal will be made in the southern half of the state during the week of May 7th to 12th, inclusive.

Workers have already been sent into the field and many of the Advisory Boards have met, re-organized their respective counties, accepted the quota and date of campaign. In this county workers are now being secured in every part of Gratiot in anticipation of the drive.

In speaking of the last year's work, Brigadier Withers states "We now have in operation in this division thirty-four corps, including two Swedish corps. These corps carry on the regular activities of the Salvation Army such as open-air services, indoor services, visitation of the sick, relief to the poor and where emergencies of an unusual nature occur seek the advice of the local Advisory Board and work under the direction of divisional headquarters."

"Then we have two Rescue Homes," continued the Brigadier, one located in Detroit and the other in Grand Rapids. In these institutions unfortunate girls are received from all over the state. Not one county can boast of not having sent a girl to these institutions. Here the girls are received, required to stay at least three months, they are given the best of medical care, their religious life nurtured according to their own belief and the girls encouraged to take care of their own babies. We do not approve of adopting our babies out. When these girls are ready to leave the institution, when necessary we help them to find employment where they can take their babies with them.

"The Division has rendered aid to hundreds of families during the past year in the way of giving food, milk, coal, clothing, medicines, etc. Religious services are conducted on schedule all during the year."
