

The Civil Rights Bill. We publish below the Civil Rights Bill as it recently passed the Congress under the President's Veto.

"Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That all persons born in the United States and not subject to any foreign power, excluding Indians, not taxed, are hereby declared to be citizens of the United States; and such citizens of every race and color, without regard to any previous condition of slavery or involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been convicted, shall have the same right in every State and Territory in the United States to make and enforce contracts, to sue, to be parties, and give evidence, to inherit, purchase, lease, sell, hold, and convey real and personal property, and to full and equal benefit of the laws and of the full and equal protection of the laws of the State in which they reside, as is enjoyed by white citizens, and shall be subject to like punishment, taxes, and burdens, and to none other, than the statute, ordinance, regulation, or custom to the contrary notwithstanding."

And they are hereby authorized and empowered, within their counties respectively, to appoint, in writing, under their seals, any one or more suitable persons, from time to time, to execute all such warrants and other process as may be issued by them, in and to the performance of their respective duties; and the persons so appointed to execute any warrant or process as aforesaid shall have authority to summon and call to their aid the bystanders or the posse comitatus of the proper county, or such portion of the land and naval forces of the United States, or the militia, as may be necessary to the performance of the duty with which they are charged, and to use such force as may be necessary to enforce the Constitution in which prohibitions slavery, in conformity with the provisions of this act; and said warrants shall have the same effect as if they were issued by the State or Territory in which they are issued.

And they are further enacted, That any person who shall knowingly and willfully obstruct, hinder, or prevent any officer, or other person authorized by law to execute any warrant or process issued under the provisions of this act, or any person or persons lawfully assisting him or them, from arresting any person for whose apprehension such warrant or process may have been issued, or shall rescue or attempt to rescue such person, or shall obstruct, hinder, or prevent any officer or other person lawfully authorized by the officer or other officer or other person as aforesaid, or shall harbor or conceal any person for whose arrest a warrant or process shall have been issued as aforesaid, or shall knowingly obstruct or hinder any officer or other person lawfully authorized by law to execute any warrant or process issued under the provisions of this act, or any person or persons lawfully assisting him or them, from executing any warrant or process as aforesaid, shall be deemed to be guilty of a crime, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or to imprisonment for not more than six months, by indictment and conviction before the district court of the United States for the district in which such offense was committed, or before the proper court of criminal jurisdiction, if committed within any one of the several States or Territories, or before the proper court of criminal jurisdiction, if committed within any one of the several States or Territories, or before the proper court of criminal jurisdiction, if committed within any one of the several States or Territories.
