1. That all moneys collected in the District of Columbia by collectors, postmasters, district attorneys, marshals, and clerks of the district court, &c. shall be deposited with the Treasurer of the United States.

Treasurer. If the accounts are not furnished or not audited, reasons to be stated to Congress. 15. Supervisors, naval officers, and surveyors of the customs, to be a check on the cashiers of the customs; registers over land receivers and public receivers; naval officers and surveyors over collectors; directors over treasurers of the mints; at the close of each quarter to examine their books, accounts, and money on hand, and to make a full, accurate, and faithful return to the treasury of their condition.
