

Hicks, Standard Keeper, has an agent who goes through the county on Sundays selling patent medicines and telling the colored people who vote the Democratic ticket that they vote to put themselves back into slavery, and that he is travelling around trying to catch the white people who failed to send in their measures and have them tested. I think the white people of the county ought to prohibit such people from going on their premises. I think also, however, that you took the right course in advising people that if it is law to have their weights and measures tested, they ought to do it. Now I would like to hear you on such conduct as this agent of P. S. Hicks's.

This conduct is contemptible in the extreme, and the white people have a remedy at hand to stop it forthwith. Let them, as our correspondent suggests, forbid any respectable person of this stripe coming on their premises and if they persist in doing so, why put a stop to it at once by having recourse either to the law or to muscle.
