WILLIAM H. TAFT SWEEPS THE COUNTRY LIKE WHIRLWIND

New York Gives Ohioan Nearly 200,000 Majority--He Carries New York City by 5,000--Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Nebraska, Kentucky, Maryland and All Doubtful States Fall Into Line--Hughes Carries His State by 54,000--Deneen Wins Out in Illinois--Governor Johnson Re-elected in Minnesota

Taft is elected president by a large majority. He carries New York state by 100,000 to 150,000. Chairman Hitchcock claimed last night that Taft would have 325 votes in the electoral college. He carries in addition to New York, the solid New England and eastern states and a great share of the west and middle west.

Telegram of congratulations were sent to Taft early in the evening by Sherman, the vice presidential nominee, Governor Hughes and other prominent Republicans. Telegrams were also sent congratulating Chairman Hitchcock of the national committee.

The New York World, the New York Times and other Democratic and independent newspapers conceded Taft's election early in the evening. Ha'st's paper, the American, claimed Taft's election at nine o'clock

in the evening.

Hughes is elected in New York, his majority being placed at 25,000. Bryan and Chanler ran far below expectations in Greater New York, which was expected to furnish 110,000 majority for the Democratic ticket.

The Republicans have carried the congressional elections and will have a majority in the next house.

Governor Johnson is re-elected in Minnesota. He carries Ramsey and Hennepin counties and will probably have 25,000 majority in the state--against a majority of 72,000 two years ago.

The national Republican ticket will carry Minnesota by 80,000.

Speaker Cannon is re-elected at Danville by a majority of 6,000 to 7,000.

Indications point to a victory for Taft in Kentucky.



OVERWHELMING

Returns at 2 O'clock This Morning Show Still Greater Republican Victory--Taft Carries Greater New York--Hughes Has 76,000 Plurality

New York, N. Y., Nov. 4, 2 a. m.--Election returns from throughout the United States received up to an early hour this morning show the following results:

Taft elected president with 298 votes, securing thirteen doubtful states. Practically no change is indicated in the complexion of the national house of representatives.

The United States senate will retain the present Republican majority.

Hughes is re-elected in New York state by about 76,000 majority.

Indiana has gone for Taft by from 15,000 to 18,000 plurality.

Bryan apparently has carried Nebraska. Republicans still control the state.

Ohio returns are delayed owing to the immense size of the ballot, but Taft has carried the state by a majority ranging from 50,000 to 75,000. Taft carried New York City by about 11,000 plurality, this being the first time the city has given its vote to a Republican vice presidential candidate since 1896, when McKinley had a small plurality.

Taft received a greater plurality in New York state than did President Roosevelt four years ago, the indications pointing to 190,000 for Taft, as against 175,000 for Roosevelt. Hisgen, the Independence party candidate for president, gets 23,000 votes in Greater New York.

Indications are for Democratic governors in several of the middle west states that have given their presidential votes to Taft.

Taft has exceeded the Roosevelt plurality in New Jersey, Massachusetts as well as in New York.

Mr. Taft practically carried every so-called doubtful state except Colorado. Bryan has carried Nevada and Montana in addition to the solid south, which includes Missouri. Returns from Colorado and Maryland are too meager to form definite conclusions as to their ultimate alignment.

CUMMINS

Seems to Have Won in Iowa--State Gives Taft 50,000 Majority

Des Moines, Ia., Nov. 3.--Returns from the state outside of Des Moines indicate that Taft has carried Iowa by 30,000 to 50,000. The entire Republican state ticket has been elected. The indications are that Cummins has defeated Lacey for the United States senatorship.
