NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION. Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution passed by the board of city commissioners of the city of Bismarck, North Dakota, at a regular meeting held the 1st day of August, 1910, there will be a special election held in said city on the 29th day of August, A. D. 1910, for the purpose of electing a member of the board of city commissioners of said city to fill the vacancy on said board caused by the death of Henry J. Geleman, the term of the commissioner to be so elected to end April 18, 1911.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION. Whereas, under and by virtue of the provisions of sub-division 5 of section 2678, of article 4, of chapter 30, of the Revised Codes of North Dakota,

1905, the city of Bismarck, North Dakota, when authorized by a majority vote at any general or special election at which election the question is submitted to the legal voters, may borrow money on the credit of the city for corporation purposes and issue its bonds therefor, in such amount and form, and on such conditions as it shall prescribe, not exceeding five (5) per cent of the taxable property therein, as determined by the last preceding assessment, including existing indebtedness; and,

Whereas, the bond issue herein proposed for corporation purposes, to-wit: To provide for the erection of a public building necessary for the use of the city to be known as the Fire Hall, is within the five (5) per cent limit on the value of the taxable property in the said city, as shown by the city assessment of 1909, the last preceding assessment; Therefore be it

Resolved by the board of city commissioners of the city of Bismarck, North Dakota, that a special election be called to be held Monday, the 29th day of August, A. D. 1910, at which special election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the city of Bismarck the question whether or not fifteen thousand (\$15,000) dollars of the bonds of the city of Bismarck shall be issued for corporation purposes aforesaid, viz., to provide for the erection of a public building necessary for the use of the city to be known as the Fire Hall, said bonds to be in the denomination of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of four (4) per cent per annum, payable annually, and to mature as follows: Five thousand (\$5,000) dollars in five years from the date of issue thereof; five thousand (\$5,000) dollars in ten years from the date of issue thereof, and five thousand (\$5,000) dollars in fifteen years from the date of the issue thereof.

Such proposed public building to be located on Thayer street, between Fifth and Sixth streets in said city. The following polling places for said election are hereby named: 1st ward, High school building; 2nd ward, Boyle building, east side of Broadway; 3d ward, Residence of M. A. Edberg, 801 7th street; 4th ward, Robidoux building, southwest corner Front and Sixth streets; 5th ward--City hall, over French & Welch hardware store, north side of Main street, between Third and Fourth streets; 6th ward--Jones' paint shop, east side of Seventh street, north of Broadway.

That the city auditor be and he hereby is instructed to give legal notice of such special election by the publication of a certified copy of this resolution for twenty (20) days next preceding the day of such special election, as provided by law.
