Fargo and Grand Forks has nothing over Bismarck in the way of wireless telegraphy, although, perhaps, the instruments in the Valley towns are a bit stronger and farther reaching than those here.

Monday evening as Charlie Cushing was reading by the side of his wireless set with the receivers over his ears, as is frequently his custom, he caught a radiogram being sent from Guantanamo, Cuba, the message being quite distinct at times and indistinct at others so that the sense of the message could not be fully made out, but he received sufficient, together with the signatures to convince him that the message was from the naval station on the south side of Cuba.

At other times, young Cushing has heard commercial messages passing between points, which, by the way, he made himself, being capable of catching messages from long distances but are not strong enough to send to equally distant points.

James Doran's wireless instruments are among the best in the Northwest and when he gets up an aerial of the proper height will be able to communicate easily with stations several hundred miles away. In fact he has frequently caught commercial messages passing between points outside the state and since his apparatus is in make and strength of instruments are constant so that in a short time it is expected this city will be in communication by wireless telegraphy with not only Fargo and Grand Forks, but cities beyond the state limits.

An effort is being made to interest boys at Mandan in wireless, which, if successful, will furnish a delightful and profitable source of amusement and study to the youngsters, the cost being small and the scientific knowledge attained being worth twice the expense.
