REMARKABLE ESCAPE.
Kenmare, N. D., June 5.—What was probably the most remarkable escape from death ever experienced in Kenmare was that of little Avis Viola Hiland, the 2-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Hiland, on Wednesday afternoon, when she fell from the second story window of the Bertelson department store, striking on the base of her head and shoulder on the cement walk.

Those who witnessed the fall felt certain that it would be fatal. The child was taken to Dr. Ewing's office for examination and it was found that the collar bone was broken, and there was a bad fracture at the base of the skull. The child is slowly recovering now, and it is fully believed that it will completely regain its health in every way.

OUTLOOK IS BRIGHT.
Grand Forks, June 5.—That the crop prospects of North Dakota were never better than they are at present is the opinion of L. J. Bricker, general immigration agent of the Northern Pacific railway. Mr. Bricker was in Grand Forks last week after visiting a number of farmers' clubs and based his opinion on what he saw and heard from the farmers in various parts of the state. According to Mr. Bricker the cool weather of the early spring had a tendency to give the grain a deep rooting and this together with the accumulated moisture is bound to carry the crop through the hot weather to come. He was also enthusiastic over the manner in which the farmers are making the change from the one crop plan to diversified farming and to a more thorough cultivation of the soil. He expressed the firm conviction that the increased interest in live stock and diversified farming general is bound to make North Dakota one of the most prosperous states in the Union.
