

The difference leaves me for the next seven months the sum of \$5,977.81 to go on before reaching the expenditure during my predecessor.

During the first year of Smith and McCurdy's administration the expenditures amounted to \$12,237.89, as against mine for the same length of time, \$9,931.66.

When you take into consideration that by act of the legislature the mileage of the sheriff was increased from 5 cents per mile to 10 cents per mile, and that the law became operative January 1st, 1913, the mileage charge by law has under my administration been twice as much as that under my predecessor, yet no matter who elected, that charge cannot be curtailed.

In the Coccimiglio Murder Case and the Robertson Rape case, I found myself compelled to detain witness, entailing an unforeseen and in my judgment unavoidable expense of approximately \$800.00. No man, be he whom he may, can predict what criminal matters may arise, hence a promise to keep down expenses is futile, a resort to sophistry and wholly devoid of sincerity.

My opponent informs you that "to fill this office properly a man should be honest, able and willing to do the work." Does the gentleman mean to insinuate that I have been lacking in either of the foregoing qualifications, if not, what does he mean?

Self praise always carries with it a disagreeable odor. As for myself I want to be judged fairly, unbiased and unprejudiced, leaving the voter to choose according to the rules of fair play and a square deal. Select for yourself whom you deem worthy of your confidence.
