In the Herault Kingdom, however, these men do not carry boards upon which the desired information is made known to all and sundry, but resort to the medium of picture-post cards, upon which the announcement is inscribed. Anything from one to a dozen flags may be requisitioned, and these are carried through the streets by boys and men, forming a picturesque moving advertisement. — World Magazine
