SECOND ANNUAL GARRISON SHOW

MANY RECRUITS ARE DRILLING AT ALDERSHOT

100,000 Men Being Drilled Into Shape for Fighting—Work is Hard But Men Like it.

Aldershot, September 30.—Lieutenant General Sir Archibald Hunter is in charge of 100,000 Aldershot "rookies," nine-tenths of whom never handled a gun.

In ordinary time of peace 30,000 men is as big a force as the barracks at Aldershot are trained to accommodate.

The campus at Aldershot spread over the plains throughout an area at least five miles square.

Comfortable Quarters. The recruits at Aldershot are comfortably housed and, what ever complaints to the contrary may appear in London papers.

The only disappointed ones in evidence were those who were being sent away. In the rush of enlistment many were taken on with rather superficial examination and are now being weeded out.

Hard Training. The recruits are earnest and are worked very hard. One basic principle of the training seems to be the order that every man shall walk at least fifteen miles daily.

Immense Task. As for the immense amount of detail necessary to equip the troops that are now being raised in England, some idea of the undertaking may be gleaned from two requisitions issued by the war office yesterday.
