

DR. RILEY DIES IN STATE PRISON

Dr. James J. Riley died at the state prison Sunday of oedema of the larynx. The doctor was sent up about two years ago, to serve ten years. He was 53 years of age. He had practiced medicine in this state for 39 years at Milton and Osunbrock in Cavalier county, starting in at Olga in the early days. He was unmarried and was rated as well to do. Deputy Warden Peter Reid left last night for Milton with the remains and will turn them over to Peter W. T. Riley, a brother, and Mrs. J. W. Pratten, a sister. Dr. Riley was exceedingly popular with all of the men at the state prison and was always ready and willing to extend aid to them at any hour of the night or day.
