

# MANY SETTLERS COMING TO STATE

### Immigration Department Is Kept Busy Supplying Necessary Information.

Thought at this time of the year it is rather quiet in the various departments at the capitol, notwithstanding the fact that the immigration department is somewhat in a state of uncertain condition, this department is one of the busiest at present. Reports of abundant crops which are to be harvested in North Dakota this season seem to have gone forth over the entire United States, and judging from the scores of letters received daily by State Immigration Agent Neal, all eyes are turned this way.

There are hundreds in other states who seem to have realized the excellent quality of North Dakota and are desirous of more information with a view of moving to North Dakota and becoming citizens in that state. There are also numerous inquiries from farm hands, who desire to come here and work in the harvest fields and during threshing.

During the last several months the immigration commission, handicapped though it has been, succeeded in locating many new settlers in all parts of the state. It also succeeded in locating farm help, tradesmen, house servants, etc., to many of our citizens, and if those who are desirous of help, whether it be on the farm or in the shop, will notify the

department, they can be supplied with any kind of help they may desire, such as farm hands, engineers, carpenters, cooks, house servants, etc. Governor Hanna has aided the department a great deal through his personal efforts in interesting a large number of settlers and in urging them to move to this state. They are all a good class of people and will make good citizens.

It seems to be the psychological time for North Dakota to do its best and there never has been a time in the history of the state when it would be so easy to secure settlers. If the immigration appropriation is permitted to go into effect some excellent work will be done this coming fall and winter, and many new settlers will undoubtedly be placed in North Dakota next spring.


