Learned, the American champion, several years ago—has just sailed for England to follow in the steps of the late Anthony F. Wilding of New Zealand and offer his services to the war office. He proposes to go into training immediately on his arrival to qualify as a lieutenant in a flying corps, but if the preparation involves a long course of instruction he will endeavor to be accepted by the Royal Artillery. Heath, better known as "Pod" Heath, is a Victorian and one of the best tennis players the commonwealth has produced. His enlistment in the British forces will be the third from among the Australian Davis cup players, Captain Wilding and Stanley N. Doubt having volunteered early in the war.
