FORMER SCHOOL TEACHER RUNNING MODEL FARM.

Sentinel Butte, N. D., Aug. 7.—J. A. Kitchen, a former superintendent of schools in Billings and later in Golden Valley county, is looked upon as one of the most successful farmers around Sentinel Butte. This year he has 1,200 acres under cultivation, including 130 acres of alfalfa, 70 acres of corn and 40 acres of bronze grass which is used for pasturage. Mr. Kitchen is erecting a 180-ton silo. He has a model farm and is making it pay out in fine shape.

The Kitchen farm is only a mile and a half from town and the road is being surfaced with six to eight inches of scoria, which will make it one of the finest drives in Golden Valley.

Mr. Kitchen believes in helping out all legitimate home enterprises and has recently accepted the presidency of a \$25,000 custom flouring mill which is being erected at Sentinel Butte. John Odland is secretary and treasurer and it is hoped to get the mill grinding early in October. Its capacity will be 50 barrels daily.

WICKEDEST FACE IN THE WORLD

To Be Seen in D'Annunzio's "La Gioconda" at the Grand Theatre.

According to New York artists and sculptors, the most fascinatingly wicked and seductively beautiful face in the world belongs to Mademoiselle Theda Bara, the Parisian beauty and late leading woman of Le Theatre Antoine, Paris, the "house of thrills of the French capital." Bara's extraordinary gifts for portrayal of beautiful but soulless women, whose lips scorch like living fire and whose kisses is destruction. The author himself, who says "The Clemenceau Case in Italy, insisted on Mlle. Bara's playing the Vampire role of Gioconda before he would sign with William Fox for the film rights.

Charles Dana Gibson, who modeled Mlle. Bara as "Sin," recently said: "Never have I had a model who impressed me as deeply as Miss Bara. In her dark eyes lurks the lure of the Vampire; in her every sinuous movement there is a pantherish suggestion that is wonderfully evil and made her a perfect model for the subject I desired. This in no way reflects on Mlle. Bara, who is one of the most charming women I have ever met, and who indignantly denies—although there is no need for her to do so to those who know her—that there is any of the Vampire in her nature."

James Montgomery Flagg is another famous illustrator who has succeeded in coaxing the Vampire Woman to pose for him in a striking picture, called "The Vampire." In it Mlle. Bara is seen in a greenish light, with snake-like coils of hair hanging about a dead-white face, in which two burning and passionate eyes glow with a subdued flame.



ONE OF STATE'S BEAUTY SPOTS

Old Settlers' State Park Has Strong Historic Interest.

Walhalla, N. D., Aug. 6.—Under the Park management much has been done to beautify the Old Settlers' State park at Walhalla, and in a short time it will be another of the beauty spots of this vicinity and of the state, as it is already one of foremost interest, as a historical point, being the location of the Henry Trading post of 1798-1808. From a point of scenic beauty, it is one of the finest views in the state. Located on a plateau some 100 feet higher than Walhalla, southwest of the city, and about a quarter of a mile distant, its five acres lie along the banks of the Pembina, just where the river issues from between the hills which tower 200 feet higher than the park.

The old log house erected on its site was the original Kittson trading post of 1843, which was taken down from its original location on the Bellevue block opposite the Catholic church, some ten years ago and removed to its present historical setting after the land had been deeded to the state by John F. Mager, and turned over to the state for historical park purposes.

Under an appropriation from the state in 1913, improvements were undertaken under the supervision of C. W. Andrews, secretary of the Red River Valley Old Settlers' association. Many choice plants and shrubs were set out and considerable money spent in cleaning out and unbrushing. The past spring a commission was appointed to look after the park and put it in shape. Mr. Mager was elected chairman. Since then there has been more clearing out, plants, trees and shrubs planted and walks and driveways planned and a thinning of the trees proposed, which will add to its beauty and make the Old Settlers' park another point of interest to the visitors at Walhalla. This gives Walhalla three parks with delightful shade, with beautiful flowers, plants and trees—Mager's grove, the largest and finest natural park in the state on the banks of the Pembina river, and two blocks from the center of the city; the City park, in the center of the residence district and covering a little more than three acres of ground, which, with but little care, can be made to be one of the handsomest anywhere, and Old Settlers' State park—the text for this write-up.

These, with the best race track and ball park in the state, should satisfy the most exacting for pleasure and out of door comfort, for the boating and bathing is fine, while the fishing is not to be overlooked. To outsiders we say—Walhalla equals the finest summer resort to be found in the west.

IN SERIOUS CONDITION. Frank Nelbauer, well known farmer of the Hill district, is in a critical condition as the result of an attack by a vicious horse.
