\$600 bail. The same charge is booked against Fred Lambard and his bond was placed at \$300. Harry Dilman pleaded guilty to bootlegging and was given a fine of \$200 and sentenced to 90 days in the county jail.

In raid on the livery barn at Michigan four pints of whiskey were found and three men arrested charged with bootlegging. The Pekin drug store at Pekin has been closed by the state's attorney for one year, the proprietor having pleaded guilty to illegal selling of liquor in the way of bitters and alcohol. Two gallons of alcohol were found on the premises. An injunction has also been served on the livery barn at Pekin against gambling.

AUTHORITIES IN NELSON COUNTY START CLEANUP. Lakota, N. D., Sept. 28.—State's Attorney R. J. Roberts and Sheriff A. H. Smart have opened war on the law violators of Nelson county and as a result of work done by operatives of the Howell Detective agency of Fargo several bootleggers have landed in the law's net.

At Michigan Gust Burendal, Fred Lambard and Henry Dilman were arrested by Sheriff Smart upon evidence secured by the detectives. Burendal is charged with bootlegging. He waived examination and is out on

Pub. Co. \$15.93, Brown Bros. \$53.00, G. C. Wachtler, guardian, \$48.00, A. A. Vesperman \$20.00. Commissioner Best was authorized to employ the necessary help to clean

the lamps on the boulevard lighting system. The contract for 600 feet of fire hose was awarded to the Bi-lateral Fire Hose Company at \$0.50 per foot; f. o. b. Bismarck.

The bid for sewer construction on First street 262 feet north from Avenue A, was rejected and the auditor directed to re-advertise.

Commissioner Bertsch was directed to secure estimates of the cost of installing water at the sewer lift at the intersection of Front street and Third street. On motion the board adjourned.
