We are fully aware of the dominating interests of natural parents. We realize that often the wealth of parents has been a stumbling block to the progress of their children, rather than an advantage.

We believe, however, that a child is entitled to both a father and a mother and that the love and guidance and support of the one is as necessary to him as is that of the other.

of ill treatment merely because of the fact of relationship? The boy is now at an age where he needs the guidance of a father as well as of a mother; at an age where an unkind word coupled with the knowledge of the past might again send him a wanderer upon the face of the earth.

In refusing to interfere with the present custody of the infant and in quashing the writ of habeas corpus, we are following not merely the dictates of our own consciences and of our own judgments but the almost unanimous decisions of the courts of the country which have been rendered under similar circumstances.

An examination of the child has been made and his desire is certainly to stay with the Clarks and in a case such as this the wishes of the child may well be considered.

We must also remember that after all the child is but the future citizen and that paramount to the interests of any of the parties to the litigation and even of the parents themselves are the interests of the parent state.

The writ of habeas corpus will be quashed. Each party will pay his own costs.

The British tansteamer, Kanakuk, of 4,000 tons gross, has been destroyed by fire and sunk, according to advices received here today from Borneo, East India, under date of Oct. 2.

French fighting of a violent nature throughout the day at Aitais is reported in the French official communication issued tonight, which adds to the south of Givenchy the Germans have gained a footing at the crossing of Five Roads, but were repulsed everywhere else.

The German steamer, Svioni, of Stettin has been torpedoed in the Baltic by a British submarine, according to an Amsterdam dispatch to Reuter's Telegram company.
