

QUARTERLY MEETING OF FARMERS' UNION

Prof. Hollis of Agricultural College Addresses Burleigh Farmers.

The quarterly meeting of the Burleigh county organization of the Farmers' Educational and Co-operative Union was held at the Farmers' Union hall here yesterday. The meeting was a very interesting one. Prof. A. P. Hollis of the state Agricultural college, who has been conducting the county teachers' institute here this week, delivered an address, as did State Superintendent of Public Instruction E. J. Taylor. Prof. Hollis gave a very instructive talk on the value of an education, as an added asset for farm work and all other occupations, which greatly pleased his listeners. A committee, consisting of J. F. Perkins, Regan; O. M. Kolop, Regan; Nels Christianson, Wing; Mr. Riley, Driscoll, and Albin Hedstrom of Wilton, was selected to interview State Auditor Carl O. Jorgenson, in regard to having a change made in the schedule of assessments relative to farm property. The farmers allege the elaborate assessment sheet for farm property, as compared with city property, is a discrimination against them.



Hopewell, Dec. 10.—The residents of Hopewell, at a mass meeting to night, made plans to replace with buildings of brick and concrete the flimsy mushroom town of frame structures that was swept away by yesterday's fire. The meeting attended by more than a 1,000 of the town's 2,500 homeless inhabitants, also reconstructed the city government and took full steps toward securing a city charter. A commission was elected to have charge of municipal affairs until the meeting of the Virginia legislature next month, the earliest date at which a charter could be ratified.

Minot, N. D., Dec. 10.—Jack O'Neil, who was convicted of robbery in the first degree at the present session of the district court, died at a local hospital this morning, of pneumonia. He, with another man, was charged with doing a highway robbery stunt at Kenmare last summer, and the sentence of the court on the sick criminal was not imposed yesterday along with the others because of his serious condition. Just before he died he gave his true name, which he said was Howard Clayton Stuart. He said his mother's name was Eldie Perkins and that he believed she lived at Los Angeles, though he had not heard from her for three years.
