

FORMER PROMINENT RESIDENT PASSES

E. R. Kennedy, Formerly of Ludden, N. D., Passes Away in California Home.

Word has been received here of the death of E. R. Kennedy, a former well known resident of Ludden, N. D., which occurred last week in the family home in San Diego, Cal. For many years Mr. Kennedy was prominent in politics in Dickey county and was a staunch republican. He was born in Rochester, N. Y., July 6, 1823. When a young man he came west with his parents, to Elgin, Ill., and later located in Ludden. He was at one time a member of the board of trustees of the insane asylum at Jamestown, receiving the appointment under Governor Mellette. He served as delegate to the state conventions of 1890, 1892, 1898, 1900, 1902, 1904, and 1906, and had been the political sponsor of many men who have risen to great political prominence in the state's affairs. A crowning achievement to Mr. Kennedy's career was the dedication of the monument erected on the Whiteside Hill battlefield in 1909. He was a charter member of the Baptist church of Ludden.
