**DICKEY COUNTY BOY  
HEAD OF INSTITUTE**

Fargo, N. D., Dec. 13.—The annual institute of boys and girls of the North Dakota schools, held at the agricultural college for four days, was one of the most successful sessions of the kind. The last act was the election of officers as follows: President, Francis Kelsh, Dickey county; vice president, Vernon Wellmer, Benson county; secretary, Ida Edinger, Wells county; treasurer, Horace Judd, Tower county.

Francis Kelsh succeeds Jay Wilcox, who for the past year has been president of the institute and has conducted the meeting here in a manner that would do credit to a fully grown man. Director Thomas Cooper addressed the boys and girls just before adjournment in which he urged them to go out into their part of the country as

missionaries for the advancement of better farming. He urged the boys to continue their corn work until North Dakota was producing from 60 to 70 bushels of corn per acre. He said that this yield was possible and that it would be up to the boys of the institute and others like them to make it a reality.

There were 130 regular delegates to the convention, coming from twenty-four counties of the state. In addition to these delegates there were the county superintendent and a deputy from the office, present with each delegation.

New York, Dec. 13.—A woman and two children lost their lives in a tenement fire, of unknown origin, in the upper east side, late today. Firemen hampered by freezing water and a blinding snow storm, rescued 39 women and children. Several escapees while the police dragged a number of others from burning hallways.

**SEVERE STORM  
SWEEPS THE EAST**

Washington, Dec. 13.—The storm, which in the last 24 hours brought to the North Atlantic seaboard and the Great Lakes the first heavy snowfall of the season, was central off Sandy Hook, N. Y., and was moving northeastward. New York City reported the greatest velocity, it reaching a maximum of 64 miles an hour.

No unseasonable temperatures were recorded in the storm area, but a cold wave in the northwest today sent the mercury to a new low mark for the season.

North Dakota reported the first winter zero weather there.

**NEW YORK STORM BOUND.**

New York, Dec. 13.—New York experienced today the first severe snow storm of the season. Heavy wet snow driven by a high wind fell throughout the afternoon and during the greater part of the night, interfering with city traffic and tying up shipping in the harbor. Out-bound vessels, especially coastwise craft, did not sail and many incoming vessels were unable to make their piers on account of the blinding snow.

Owing to the slushy condition of the streets accidents were frequent. Fourteen thousand men were called out to attack the blanket of snow, estimated at three inches.

**One Man Killed.**

Philadelphia—One man was killed and several seriously injured and there were a number of minor accidents as a result of the snow storm which swept the eastern section of the state today. Traffic was only slightly impeded.

Boston Tied Up.  
Boston—The most severe storm of the winter swept over New England today and tonight. Inland cities report heavy falls of snow, which greatly handicapped steam and electric railroad traffic. Points along the coast were drenched under a fall of rain, driven by a gale of 50 to 60 miles an hour.
