

CIVIL WAR VET ANSWERS LAST CALL.

Fargo, N. D., Jan. 6.—Another veteran of the civil war answered roll call yesterday afternoon when John P. Hutchinson passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. W. Resley.

Mr. Hutchinson was born in Butler county, Pa., on April 16, 1842. At the beginning of the civil war he enlisted in Company G, Seventh Minnesota volunteers, serving to the end of the war. He was one of the early pioneers of the Red river valley, coming to Fort Abercrombie in 1877 and filing on a homestead. In the fall of 1879 he brought his family there and resided continuously up to 1908, when he came to Fargo with his daughter, four sons, Samuel G. of Ryder, N. D., Earl W. of Abercrombie, N. D., Roy F. of Amidon, N. D., and Ray Z. of Rhame, N. D.

The remains will be shipped to Wahpeton and laid beside those of his wife, who died Jan. 29, 1899.
