**GATHERING FACTS ON NO. DAK. TEACHERS**

**Circular Letter to All Teachers in State From U. S. Commissioner Claxton.**

The following circular letter, which is self-explanatory, was sent out by United States Commissioner of Education P. P. Claxton, to all teachers in the state of North Dakota:

"Upon the request of the state board of regents, the United States board of education is undertaking an educational survey of North Dakota. For this purpose a survey commission has been appointed, which is acting under the general direction of the United States commissioner of education.

"One of the first tasks to be undertaken in a study of educational conditions is to bring together the essential facts concerning the teachers, such as: Their professional preparation and experience, the sources of the supply of teachers, and the popular estimate of the value of education as indicated in the compensation of teachers.

"The co-operation of every member of the teaching staff of the public schools of North Dakota is requested in the effort to make the report of this survey an accurate and complete statement of the facts. Your state superintendent, your county superintendent, or your city superintendent of schools will gladly answer questions concerning the survey.

"It is not within the province of this study to inquire into the qualifications or efficiency of teachers for the purpose of making recommenda-
