WORDS' MEANINGS EXPANDED BY STUDY

Simplest Phrase Often Contains Great Beauties of Sentiment.

We sometimes speak of a "kind" person, things of the same kind, and again of "man-kind," but do we ever reflect that the three words come from the same root? That wonderful genius, Shakespeare, meant more than a mere play on words, when he put into Hamlet's mouth—who was alluding to his father's brother—"A little more than kin, and less than kind." A "kind" person is one who treats other people as his kindred, and by his words or actions confesses his kinship. Things of the "same kind" are of the same family. "Man-kind" includes the whole human race. The meaning of the word "kind" unfolds itself as a flower develops, leaf by leaf.
