

MINOT TO HAVE NEXT MEETING

Mechanics of State End Convention After Warm Session.

Grand Forks, Feb. 5.-Members of the Mechanics' Mutual Benefit association of North Dakota closed their annual meeting at the Grand Forks Commercial club Thursday afternoon, after selecting Minot as the place for the 1916 session.

The organization had received an invitation to the Magic City from W. E. Holbein, secretary of the Minot Association of Commerce.

The appointment of a committee to revise the schedule of prices for blacksmith work to win force in this state after a warm debate among the members was the feature of the morning session. The committee will report on the revised scale for work March 1.

Owing to the European war, it is claimed that the cost of materials used in blacksmith work has advanced 50 per cent, and an increase in prices to meet this advance is necessary.

The members of the committee are J. C. Mirehouse, Langdon; C. W. Beyers, Bottineau; and John Bathgate, of Grand Forks. Their appointment was made after a warm debate regarding various phases of the situation.

The report of the legislative committee of the association was presented by J. H. Burns, of Surrey, N. D. During the last few months a mechanics' labor lien law has been drafted, which will be presented at the next session of the state legislature.

William Mills, of Fargo, the newly chosen president of the association was formally installed in office, Napoleon LeFleur of St. Paul, acting as installing officer.

FARMERS OF DUNN COUNTY ORGANIZE

Dunn Center, N. D., Feb. 5.-Pooling their interests in the organization of a county shipping association, the farmers of Dunn county have launched

an organization which they anticipate will mean big things for them in years to come.

The association, which is representative of local farmers' clubs throughout the county, will undertake to handle farm products of all kinds, shipping livestock, grain, etc., to the markets, placing the entire problem on a co-operative basis.

The association will establish offices in Dunn Center, and the entire industry will be backed by farmers generally, and by business men. There will be no profit planned.

Another feature proposed by the new association is that of organization co-operative telephone service for the entire county.

The winter term shows a large increase in attendance. So far the Registrar has 269 entrances and more are coming right along. This increase is very gratifying to the officers and teachers of the Normal.
