

SOO LINE HAS AIDED IN DEVELOPING CITY

Come Into Bismarck Fourteen Years Ago When Population Was About 3,500.

PASSENGER TRAFFIC FOR 1915 WAS HEAVY

Yearly Payroll of Company in This City Is Well Over Hundred Thousand.

What the Soo Line has done for Bismarck and a few reasons why the merchants and wholesale houses should patronize them with their freight shipments into Bismarck.

After an lapse of 13 years, we find Bismarck grown to a city of about 9,000 people and in place of vacant houses in 1902, we find no vacant houses and people waiting for houses and flats to be built so they can move to Bismarck.

An increase of patronage to the Soo means more trains, which means more train crews, more station help, more car repairers, more men in the round-houses, larger shops and more mechanics employed, which means larger payrolls and more people for Bismarck.

During the year 1915 they brought in on the North Soo passengers and on the South Soo a total number of passengers into Bismarck of 30,828.

In addition to this, they employ an average number of 162 people per month with an average monthly payroll of \$10,158.15 or a total of \$121,837.73 for the year 1915.

These people all leave money in Bismarck. The total tonnage shipped out on

LIVESTOCK MEN MEET HERE NEXT

First Session to Be Held in Central North Dakota.

ACCEPT INVITATION. Secretary Commercial Club, Bismarck, N. D.

Dear Sir: I have the pleasure of informing you that in response to your kind invitation, the North Dakota Live Stock Association voted to hold its next annual meeting at Bismarck on January 24 and 25, 1917.

The North Dakota Live Stock association will meet in central North Dakota for the first time in the history of the organization January 24 and 25, 1917, when it will hold its annual convention in Bismarck, in response to invitations from the Capital City Commercial club extended through Alex McDonald of Bismarck and Glencoe: R. F. Flint, commissioner of agriculture and labor, and other prominent stockmen of this section of the state.

The annual conventions of the live stock association were for years held at Fargo in conjunction with the grain growers' meeting. Two years ago Grand Forks secured the meeting, and it was held there a second time last week. Some weeks ago the Commercial club became active in bringing the next convention to this city.

Messrs. McDonald and Flint went to Grand Forks determined to bring back the bacon, and they succeeded in spite of the efforts of Fargo, Grand Forks and Devils Lake to keep the convention in the eastern part of the state. In addition, Mr. McDonald brought home with him the presidency, and when he changed cars here yesterday morning for Glencoe, he pronounced himself very well pleased with the outcome of the Grand Forks meeting.

The North Dakota Live Stock association is one of the largest and most important organizations in the state. More than 200 prominent live stock men attended last week's meeting in Grand Forks, and it is hoped, because of the central location of Bismarck, and because of the added attraction which will be offered by the 1917 legislative session, to greatly increase the attendance here.

The Commercial club is grateful for the recognition accorded Bismarck and the compliment paid to the live stock interests of central and western North Dakota, and the local organization hopes to co-operate with President McDonald in making the 1917 session the most successful on record.

The Capital City will also be the convention city in 1917. In addition to the live stock men, the North Dakota Press association convention is already assured for the early part of the year, and invitations have been extended to a number of other organizations which it is believed will look with favor upon Bismarck. In the summer will come the big state convention of the Elks and it is possible that another gathering of almost equal magnitude may be commanded. At least a dozen large state meetings may be depended upon, and the Commercial club convention bureau is well satisfied with the results of its efforts to date.

LID PLACED ON SUNDAY CONCERT

George Register and A. J. Nathan Evoke One of Our Blue Laws.

Several hundred people were turned away in sub-zero weather Sunday afternoon when George Register and A. J. Nathan forced the lid on the concert billed for the Auditorium under the auspices of the Knights of Pythias.

Three or four hundred people braved the wintry blasts for an afternoon of harmless diversion, but George Register and J. Nathan anticipated their pleasure and lodged formal complaint with the authorities under section 9231 of the Revised Code of 1913 which saith:

"It shall be unlawful to keep open or to run or permit the running of any theatre, show, moving picture show or theatrical performance upon the first day of the week, commonly called the Sabbath."

Despite the fact that the concert was announced Friday evening and advertised in the papers of Saturday morning, these defenders of the public morals hesitated until three or four hundred men, women and children had braved the elements to listen to the discourse of sweet sounds.

The promoters offered to waive the admission fee and allow the sacred concert to go on and depend on a collection. The authorities, however, upon complaint of Messrs. Nathan and Register told the management of the Auditorium to keep the doors closed and taete orders were obeyed, and the citizens with their wives and families plowed through the snow to cogitate upon the hidden statutes of the state which periodically serve to protect reformers from the public gaze.

It is interesting to know that among other things, the Sunday law prohibits surf bathing in the Missouri river on the first day of the week. There were several in the crowd Sunday who, if they could have put their hands upon Nathan and Register, would have cracked the ice and fractured this statute.
