

TUBERCULAR DEATHS DECREASED GREATLY

Proved by Society for Study and Prevention of Tubercu-

losis.

New York, March 11.—The anti-tuberculosis movement organized in the last ten years is having a marked effect on the mortality from that disease, says a statement issued today by the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis. The death rate from that cause seems

to be declining more rapidly than the general rate from all other causes, the association asserts.

In proof of this, the association points to the report of the bureau of census showing that the tuberculosis death rate declined from 290.7 per 100,000 population in 1901 to 146.8 in 1914. Nevertheless, the report showed that in 1914, tuberculosis caused over 95 per cent of all deaths in the registration area of the United States. The association asserts there are no win this country over 1,500 anti-tuberculosis associations, 600 sanitariums and hospitals, 450 dispensaries, 800 open air schools and over 100,000 persons actively interested in the prevention of tuberculosis.

\$25,000 GIFT FOR JAMESTOWN COLLEGE

Jamestown, N. D., March 11.—Word was received here this morning from Pres. B. H. Kroeze of Jamestown college, stating that he had succeeded in securing an additional \$25,000 endowment for the institution.

The telegram came from New York, where President Kroeze is now visiting, and was received while the students were parading the city with William Landis, who won the state oratorical contest at Fargo last night, in celebration of the victory. When President Kroeze's telegram was read to the students there was prolonged

cheering and the celebration was made a dual one.

The additional \$25,000 raises the endowment of Jamestown college to about \$300,000.


Captain Chris Nelson of the police force apprehended young Larson


LUTHERANS TO MEET AT LEEDS—BIG PLANS MADE FOR MARCH 16-17




