## CORN HIGHEST IN 24 YEARS

Bulgarian Successes and Crop Report Boosts Wheat Up Few Cents.  
Chicago, September 8.—Reports of fresh Bulgarian successes in Roumania did a great deal today to lift the wheat market here and so too did correct predictions of a bullish crop report from Washington. The close, although unsettled, was two cents to three and three-eighths cents net higher; with December at \$1.56 to \$1.56 1/2 and May at \$1.57 to \$1.57 3/4. Corn gained one-eighth cent to three-eighths cents; oats finished unchanged, to three-eighths cent up; and provisions down ten cents to fifty cents.

## STOCK DEALINGS OVER MILLION

Copper Rises to New Record of 63.14; Other Metals Are Up.  
New York, Sept. 8.—Dealings in stocks were again well over the million share mark today, but the professional character of the trading was in keeping with recent conditions, a half-dozen issues supplying 50 per cent of the turnover. Foremost among these issues was Reading, which registered an extreme gain of three and five-eighths points at \$112 1/8, its best price of the current year.

Inspiration Copper also rose to the new record of 63.14 on its gain of two and three-fourths points, with concurrent strength in other metals, notably American Smelting. United States Steel was under pressure, but only yielded a fraction at most, and closed at a net gain of one-fourth point. M'LAIN COUNTY FIELDS MAKING GOOD SHOWING  
Reports from Garrison, McLean county, indicate that wheat is going better than expected. The low yield will be eight bushels to the acre and many fields are going from 15 to 20 of from No. 2 to No. 1 grade. Flax will go 15 on an average. There are from 4,000 to 5,000 more acres of it planted this year. Flax proved to be better on old than on new ground. Alfalfa is in splendid condition. The early varieties of corn are out of the way of frost.
