THE MARKETS WHEAT DECLINES; RALLIES LATER ON U.S. STEEL MAKES ANOTHER RECORD

Price of Grain Closes Firm With December at \$1.50 1-8, and May at \$1.51.

Price of Metal Advances to 109; Over Million Shares Again Change Hands.

Chicago, Sept. 21.—Wheat prices rallied today on account largely of European buying, which developed after a decline here due more or less to lower quotations at Liverpool. The close was firm at \$1.50 1/8 for December and \$1.51 for May, with the market as a whole one-eighth cent off to one-fourth cent up, as compared with yesterday's finish. Corn closed one-fourth at three-eighths cents down to three-eighths cents advance. Oats at a loss of one-eighth cent to three-eighths cents and provisions ranging from twelve cents decline to a rise of ten cents.

New York, Sept. 21.—The striking feature of today's session, in which sales ran well over a million shares for the thirteenth consecutive full day, was the futile effort of an aggressive speculative faction to depress prices. Initial quotations were mainly higher, but a series of bear attacks effaced this advantage before the end of the first hour, leaving the list rather unsettled. This pressure was successfully maintained until the middle of the day, when conditions improved, chiefly in consequence of another and more general advance in Coppers, these issues responding to an announcement that producers and agents had advanced the price of the metal for November delivery to 28 1/2 cents. U. S. Steel lifted the lists to today's highest level in the final hour, and its advance to the new record of \$1.09 7/8, passing its previous top by almost a point. Bonds were strong, with an increased demand for investments. Total sales par value aggregated \$3,750,000. U. S. Bonds were unchanged on call, with Coupon 4's lower by three-fourths per cent on sale.
